

Goodness Coupon Book

Supplies

- index cards
- markers
- stickers
- stapler



- Figure out who you want to make a coupon book for. Remember that a neighbor could be someone who lives near you, works at your church, goes to your school—or anyone else!
- Think of five or six things you could do for that person. For example, you could spend time with someone, clean up his or her yard, give a hug, and shovel snow.
- Use a separate index card to make a coupon for each idea. Decorate it with markers and stickers. (For this step, preschoolers can draw a picture of each idea, and you or older kids can add captions based on what the little ones say the coupon is for.)



- Make a cover for your coupon book with another index card. Include your name and more stickers.
- Staple the coupon book on the left edge.
